Statutory Assessments

As you will be aware, children in different year groups undertake varying statutory tests at the end of the year and we have to report these on our website. They will be posted there in due course. Please find below the tables with all statutory test results for this academic year. We are delighted with such positive outcomes which really show the impact of all of the changes to the curriculum this year. The only results which are not on in the table are for the Year 4 multiplication check as there is no pass mark or data for that test. We are very pleased with all results this year and proud of our children for their dedication and hard work.
